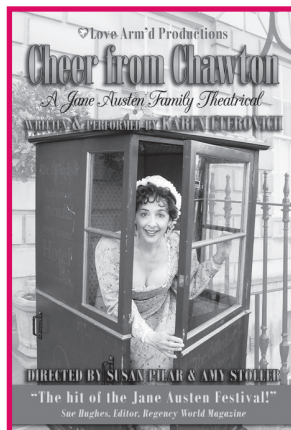
**Cheer from Chawton:**
